- 1). Special guests (Bruce Alfano (Director of West County Community Services), Jeremy Raikes and Holly Gustafson) came and updated the OCC on the **Senior Lunch Program** in Occidental:
 - Program started 30 years ago and is supported by the Council on Aging
 - Program cuts have been announced and Occidental is in the last 6 months of the Council on Aging supported program (Forestville and Occidental will have their funding cut in July)
 - Occidental will be doing their own fund raising and will be managing the program. They do need support from the Occidental Community Council to get the program kick started and launched.
 - Naomi Curtis also addressed the Occidental Community Council on the importance of the program and requested support from the OCC,
 - A motion was made and approved to pledge \$ 2,000 to this program in 2008
 - A motion was made and approved to continue our support for this program in subsequent years.
 - The group is getting prepared for a February 5th meeting with the Area Agency on Aging and would like to have an understanding of our support in advance of that meeting. Mary Szecsey will update Bruce Alfano on our decision

 - A motion was made and approved to provide KOWS with \$500 to help them with their startup costs.
